Student Absences: How to Get Caught Up with Missed Work

Its a frequent problem - a student is absent and they don't know how to make up the work that was missed. Some parents call the school and ask that work be sent home, however, if the student missed the instruction, then sending home the exercise may be useless.

When a student is absent, the student that sits next to them is asked to record and gather all of their work. Any handouts or notes are collected and kept until the student returns to school. If they have a homework buddy that lives near them, they will get their homework that night. When the student returns to school, they must review their "while you were away" folder and see the teacher at some point during the day to discuss what was missed.

It is the **student's responsibility** to seek out the teacher and find time during the day to discuss missed work. I am willing to spend recess time to review missed work with students. Students **must** make up what was missed and cannot use the excuse of not understanding the concept because of an absence. Initiating this process is an important step to be successful in high school.
